#### INTRODUCTION

Kigali International Arbitration Centre (KIAC) is the premier arbitral institution in Rwanda, established in 2010 and officially launched in 2012 as an autonomous and non-profit making institution mandated to provide institutional infrastructure for administering Arbitration, Mediation and other Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Services. The establishment of KIAC was an initiative of Rwanda's Private Sector, which met the political support of the Government of Rwanda given the Centre's contribution to the Government of Rwanda's investment and business climate reforms.

The International Council for Commercial Arbitration (ICCA) is a worldwide membership-based organisation devoted to promoting the use and improving the processes of arbitration, conciliation and other forms of dispute resolution. ICCA activities include convening congresses and conferences, sponsoring authoritative dispute resolution publications, and promoting the harmonization of arbitration and conciliation rules, laws, procedures and standards.

We are delighted to announce that ICCA and the Kigali International Arbitration Centre will host a 2025 ICCA-KIAC Conference themed **"AFRICA & INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION: UNTOLD STORIES"** on 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> June 2025 at the Kigali Convention Centre/Kigali-Rwanda. This will see the gathering of around 500 preeminent arbitration practitioners, judges, lawyers, academics and other professionals from across the world. The ICCA-KIAC Conference taking place on Thursday the 5<sup>th</sup> June 2025 will be followed by a Young ICCA workshop on Friday, 6 June, with additional side-events taking place on 4 and 6 June 2025. The Conference will feature discussions and workshops at which the theory and practice of international arbitration is explored at the highest level. We expect the Conference and related events to attract global attention from the legal profession and industry, and to receive extensive coverage in the specialist press and wider media.

This is a must-attend event for the business community, policy and decision makers on ADR and legal professionals interested in current legal frameworks, debates and developments in international arbitration in Rwanda, Africa and beyond.


#### **KIGALI CITY**
